Beyond HB 1079 and Beyond Dreaming Scholarship List

The Beyond HB 1079 was started by Royal City's DREAMer Yuriana Garcia, during her second year of college at the University of Washington Seattle. As an undocumented student at the UW, she saw that there was a need to bring awareness to the community about undocumented students. The Beyond HB 1079 Committee was formed and in Saturday March 24th, 2012 the 1st annual Beyond HB 1079 Conference was held at the University of Washington Seattle. In the following year, the 2nd annual Beyond HB 1079 Conference was held at the University of Washington Bothell on Saturday March 30th, 2013. It was also the year that the first Beyond Dreaming Scholarship List for Undocumented Students was released as a project from Seattle's DREAMER Alejandra Pérez, from the University of Washington Bothell, as she saw the need to have a centralized list for students in Washington State to go to when seeking scholarships to fund their education. This project was made possible in 2013 with the support of the Mary Gates Leadership Scholarship. The Beyond HB 1070 3rd annual conference was held at the University of Washington Tacoma and the 2014 version of the Beyond Dreaming Scholarship Packet was released on Saturday April 5th, 2014.

A Collective Contribution

Alejandra Pérez did not think it was possible to go to college due to her status. In 2010, during 10th grade, she went to a conference where she learned she could go to college through the House Bill 1079. That was when Alejandra got more committed to school and knew that the only struggle she was still facing, was the financial barrier. During her senior year of high school, she spent countless nights and many hours working on scholarships. Today, Alejandra has a total of 15 scholarships with an amount of over \$65,000. With the help of these money, Alejandra is currently attending the University of Washington Bothell pursuing a double major in Society, Ethics, and Human Behavior & American Ethnic Studies and getting her minor in Education and Society. One day, she hopes to become a teacher to impact youth through the power of education.

Eduardo Rojas recalls motivation to work hard in school to have been ignited by combination of his father leaving his family and words of encouragement from his family to pursue his dreams. He was determined to apply himself to his studies and participate in clubs and sports that would allow him to get involved in his community, develop new skills, and build his resume. Outside of school he has participated programs that have allowed him to explore his interests in Science and Medicine. Eduardo was awarded the UW Diversity scholarship and various other scholarships that have assisted him in paying for his education. He is currently a freshman at the University of Washington and is working at a lab in the department of BioEngineering. He hopes to major in BioEngineering and to continue to study to become a Doctor or Research Scientist.

House Bill 1079 (HB 1079)

In May 7, 2003, House Bill (HB) 1079 was signed into law by Governor Gary Locke. This law allows students who have lived in Washington State for three years or more to be considered “residents” when they pay for their tuition and fees at Washington State colleges and universities. HB 1079 does not change a student’s legal citizenship status. The new law means that HB1079 students qualify to pay tuition rates that all other resident students pay however they are not currently allowed to receive state or federal funding for their education. To qualify for resident tuition, students must have: earned a high school diploma or equivalent (GED) from a Washington State high school; lived in Washington State for three years prior to receiving a high school diploma or GED; lived continually in Washington since earning the high school diploma or GED; meet the college or university admission requirements expected of all other students.

The Affidavit that HB1079 Students are required to sign is a confidential statement verifying that he/she qualifies to pay resident tuition, and that he/she will seek legal permanent residency when legally permitted to do so. If an Affidavit is not provided or available, the 1079 Student should ask a trusted relative, friend, teacher, or counselor to request it from the institution he/she plans to attend. Washington Higher Education Residency Affidavit/Declaration/Certification

Effective July 1, 2003, Washington state law changed the definition of "resident student." The law makes certain students, who are not permanent residents or citizens of the United States, eligible for resident student status – and eligible to pay resident tuition rates – when they attend public colleges and universities in this state. The law does not make these students eligible to receive need-based state or federal financial aid. To qualify for resident status, students must complete this affidavit/declaration/certification if they are not permanent residents or citizens of the United States but have met the following conditions:

Resided in Washington State for the three (3) years immediately prior to receiving a high school diploma, and completed the full senior year at a Washington high school,

or

Completed the equivalent of a high school diploma and resided in Washington State for the three (3) years immediately before receiving the equivalent of the diploma,

and

Continuously resided in the State since earning the high school diploma or its equivalent.

REAL Hope Act/WA State DREAM Act

* On February 26, 2014, Governor Jay Inslee signed into law the REAL Hope Act ([SB 6523](#)), also known as the Washington Dream Act. Beginning with the 2014-15 academic year, this new law expands eligibility for the Washington State Need Grant to non-citizens who meet the [program's eligibility requirements](#) in addition to all **three residency criteria** listed below:

1. Have graduated from a Washington high school or obtained a GED in Washington
 2. Have lived in Washington for three years prior to, and continuously since, earning the high school diploma or equivalent
 3. Sign a HB 1079 affidavit (written promise) to file an application to become a permanent resident of the United States when eligible to apply
- * Students granted deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) must also complete and sign and HB 1079 Affidavit

Application can be found at www.readysetgrad.org/wasfa. Students applying for the 2014-2015 school year must submit their application by May 1st, 2014. Students must re-apply every academic year starting on January 1st and submitting by the school(s)'s priority deadline (varies by school).

NOTE: Awards vary by the type of school the student will be attending in the fall of 2014, family income, and depending if they enroll part-time or full-time. The Washington State Need Grant is available for, but not limited to, tuition & fees, books & supplies, room & board, transportation, and personal expenses.

Please note that the information provided by the student to the institution and the WASFA is protected and will not be shared with a third party, since it is protected through FERPA.

How to use this Scholarship Guide

The Beyond Dreaming Scholarship Handbook has the following sections:

The first two sections are organized by deadline from January to December. The third section is organized alphabetically.

The only way to have a shot at winning scholarships is to apply for scholarships. You'll hear it time and time again – apply early, and apply often.

Here are some tips to apply for scholarships:

Identify the right scholarships for you and check the requirements of the scholarship application. Make sure you qualify.

Identify resources to help review your application. Most applications will ask for a combination of the following.

- Scholarship essay and/or Personal statement - Always adapt your essay and personal statement to make sure you are answering what the application asks you and be prepared to find at least two people who can help you with reviewing the essays and personal statements.
- Letters of recommendation – Ask someone who knows you well at least two weeks in advance and follow-up. They should know your academic work and be aware of your commitments outside of school. We recommend that you always provide the person who will write your letter of recommendation a copy of your resume and transcript and any draft essays you have for the scholarship. The more information you give them, the better prepared they will be to write a great letter on your behalf!
- Transcript- Ask your counselor for an official transcript to submit with your application. If there has been a significant hardship that affected your transcript include a brief statement.

Plan ahead. Look ahead about three months for deadlines and update/confirm deadlines to ensure you apply in time. If a deadline or other important information is not posted, contact the organization and ask for missing information:

Save everything. Complete application requirements and save all of your written work on your computer.

Revise. Revise. Revise! Review your essays, statements, and all written work before submitting. Always ask someone to read your application one more time before the final submission.
